South Africa: Trust and the Crisis of Grievance

## Top 10 Findings

### Majority trust Business and NGOS

Business remains the most trusted institution in South Africa at 68% followed by NGOs at 63%.

#### 7 Trust in government sees modest increase

Government remains the least trusted institution in South Africa at 36%, an increase of 7% since last year and likely a result of cautious optimism around the recently established Government of National Unity.

### South Africa bucks trust trends

Out of 13 surveyed countries that saw changes in government leadership last year, South Africa is one of only two to see a significant, positive shift in trust over the past year.

(An increase of 4 points)

### Majority believe leaders are trying to mislead us

Between 74% and 78% of South Africans worry that business leaders, journalists, and government officials purposely mislead people by saying things they know are false or gross exaggerations.

# Majority hold grievances against government, business, and the rich

7 in 10 survey respondents hold grievances against business, government, and the rich.

## Cautiousness around Al for those with high grievance

Only 36% of survey respondents who indicated high grievance said they were comfortable with the use of Al in business, with only 41% saying they trust Al overall.

### 7 Trust in legitimacy of media sinks

65% of South Africans say it is becoming harder to tell if news is from a respected media or an individual trying to deceive people.

### Optimism for the future is dipping

Only 36% say that compared to today, the next generation will be better off, indicating declining optimism for the future.

## Significant minority sees hostility can drive change

4 out of 10 South Africans see hostile activism as a viable means to drive change.

### Fears of prejudice rising

78% of South Africans worry about experiencing prejudice or discrimination, highlighting a pressing societal issue that institutions must address.
